Application Requirements

Applications should be submitted electronically to: brain@biomin.net



BRAIN 1

For participation researchers must write a project proposal based on a topic involving any of BIOMIN ´s research fields of interest (see www.brain.biomin.net). The proposal must include an abstract or summary, information about applicant(s), objectives of the research project or trial, materials and methods, timelines, milestones and the project funding requested.

Summaries/abstracts of project proposals should be clear, descriptive and not longer than 300 words. They should contain the following specific information: purpose of study; experiments planned; outcomes expected.

The project proposal should include the following information:

- Information about applicants
- Objectives
- Materials and methods and available facilities/resources
- Timelines and milestones
- Summary of relevant past work applicable to the project (optional)
- Estimated budget

BRAIN 2

Participants must submit a paper describing research involved in any of BIOMIN ´s main research fields (see BRAIN Homepage: www.brain.biomin.net). The papers submitted must not be published previously in any scientific journal.

Submission also implies that all authors have approved the paper for release and are in agreement with its content. Upon acceptance of an article, the award of 300.- EUR, and participation in the competition for best biannual paper, all authors agree to transfer copyright to BIOMIN.

All publications cited in the text should be presented in a list of references following the text of the manuscript. The accuracy of the references is the responsibility of the author(s). If excerpts from other copyrighted works are included, the author(s) must obtain written permission from the copyright owners and credit the source(s) in the article.

Papers should be based on the following structure:

Abstract Submission

- Title
- Author(s)
- Affiliation
- Summaries/abstracts should be clear, descriptive and not longer than 350 words. They should contain the following specific information: purpose of study; experimental design; results obtained (preferably including quantitative data); significance of findings; conclusions.

A multidisciplinary jury will evaluate submitted abstracts regarding their relevance, novelty, and scientific impact, and invite annually at least five authors to submit a full paper.

The selected paper should follow the subsequent structure:

Selected full paper

- Title
- Authors
- Affiliation
- Introduction
- Objectives
- Materials and Methods
- Results
- Summary and Conclusions
- References

(review articles may have a different structure)

Upon receipt each invited full paper will be awarded **300.- EUR** and is entitled to participate in the competition for the best paper selected to be presented at the World Nutrition Forum. Thus, the best paper submitted will be awarded **5000.- EUR** at a biannual basis. Additionally the main author will be invited to participate at the World Nutrition Forum with all related costs covered by BIOMIN.
